Report for interschools

WEXFORD EQUESTRIAN DRAWS HUGE ENTRIES FOR INTERSCHOOLS EVENT

Wexford certainly knows how to draw a crowd with riders from all over the country travelling to compete at the interschools competition on sun 4th November. The popular venue of Wexford Equestrian hosted the event that was run in conjunction with Loreto Wexford as a fundraiser for the newly established Equestrian Club. Under the watchful eye of New teacher to the school Ms Martin who is also chef de quipe for the schools teams and Vice Principal Mr John Mc Ginney , Wexford Equestrian hosted one of the largest interschools to date with ten open teams, nineteen novice teams and sixteen primary school teams competing on the day. The school that has moved this year to the eagerly awaited New school building and location has gained many new teachers and a rejuvenated enthusiasm for the equestrian competitions with many new pupils involved and older pupils returning to the sport.

Luckily the wet weather held off for most of the day and teams started promptly at 9am with local teams competing first. The novice teams hosted in the large indoor arena saw nineteen teams declare on the day. The John Doyle track although not big was testing enough with lines and technicality and saw five teams through to the jump off on clear round scores with four teams on 4 faults to finish. The five teams clear were jumped off and sixth place was awarded to Colaiste Bhríde & St Marys for the fastest four fault round.

Each team declared two riders and jumped the first of each rider over a shorted very exciting jump off course. The Top three places went to the three teams that remained on zero scores with New Bridge riders Alice O'Sullivan and Sophie O'Neill clocking in at 73.25 clear to take the win. Presentation Green riders Emily Roche and Lauren Reck took second with a time of 73.53 and Loreto riders Anna Browne and Grace Cousins clear in 74.20. Fourth place went to visiting school East Glendalough with four faults in 80.09 and fifth place to Joint schools Gorey & Avondale in four faults in 82.31.

Best turned out went to St Gerards school .

The open teams competition started after with ten teams competing . Again a technical track saw only two teams to the jump off with Loreto wexford who rode first and Gorey community School who were last to compete jumping blistering rounds to decide the placings. Eventual winners Gorey Community School who have been knocking on the door on the last few occasions were delighted when riders Emma Steacy and Jessica Murphy jumped to finish on four faults in a time of 97.34. Loreto riders Meabh Byrne and Alannah Lacey were faster in a joint time of 80.91 but with 2 poles on the ground each placed them second. Minor placings were decided by time with Newbridge college third, St Peters & Bridgetown fourth and fifth place went to St gerards on eight faults. Sixth place went to Wesley college on twelve faults.

Best turned out LORETO WEXFORD

The Primary competition started promptly in the other arena at 9.30 with lots of eager riders many with new ponies some with old reliable ready to battle out for their teams. The 55 cm riders kicked off with over twenty four of them riding their best to represent their schools. Followed about 10.30am the 75cm riders then kicked off to complete the team results. The overall winners were the St Annes Rathangan Blue team who delivered a fault free jump off round with Faye Murphy and Edie Codd posting the fastest double clear rounds in 59.46. second place went to Drumphrea NS with Alfie Donohue and Isabelle Donohue joint efforts of a clear jump off round in a time of 62.28 was just behind the winners. Brittas Bay had an early start that paid off with riders Anna Morrissey and Caoimhe mannian clear in a time of 68.08 fourth , fifth and sixth place went to St kevins tara Hill, St Carrigbeg mixed school and Ballygarrett/ Ballycanew mixed school respectively. Seventh place for the purpose of the league table was awarded to Sheilbaggan Ns , eight place to Carnew, coolfancy and clonegal ns , ninth placed team Mixed purple and tenth place school Ballinkillen Carlow. All these ten teams were through to the jump off and now ahve gained points for the the overall primary league competition that runs at wexford equestrian. The Next leg of the Wexford Primary and novice schools league runs on sun 20th January 2019.

Individual winners placed in the 70.80.90.1m and 1.10 classes are all listed in the results section of the papers but the winners of each class received great prizes sponsored by many local companies and Loreto wexford committee would like to thanks them most sincerely for the support. A special mention for the Judges Trish Burl, Shelly Murphy and Ciaran Byrne who dedicated their time on the day free of charge in support of the fundraiser . Mr Mcginney vice principal of the loreto wexford and Ms Martin of the loreto Wexford were on hand all day for presentations. The loreto Girls made a tremendous effort leading up to the event to organise everything and were there from dawn to dusk to help in the running of the event. Parents of the students of course need to be recognised also supporting the girls in any way possible. A special thanks to Wexford Equestrian for the organisation on the day with the fantastic facilities that even offered riders the option to jump in the fabulous derby arena too !!
